

Bo nauka nie musi być nudna!

If you want to **rub** some Factor 25 onto the shoulders of your favourite pop star - and forget what Britain's listening to - these are the top places you should be travelling to this summer...

A) Ibiza

It had been a hippie hangout since the Sixties, but the long trail of DJs to the Balearic island began in September 1987 when Paul Oakenfold came on holiday to celebrate his 26th birthday with friends Johnny Walker, Nicky Holloway and Danny Rampling. A friend took them to Amnesia to see DJ Alfredo and they also took ecstasy for the first time. 'I remember seeing Paul Oakenfold and Nicky Holloway dancing round the club hand-in-hand, which they may **deny** now,' Walker **recalled** years later. 'We came back like **disciples** or salesmen for this experience.' The result of their holiday was club culture as we know it. Within a year, most bands were **checking out** the vibe: New Order recorded their classic Technique there and never sounded sunnier. And what to make of Noel Gallagher buying his house on the island from none other than Tubular Bells star Mike Oldfield? Neighbouring islands such as Majorca **compete**, as does the **Cypriot resort** of Ayia Napa but Ibiza **remains** the **destination** of choice for the most open-minded music-makers.

B) Morocco

Jimi Hendrix and Bob Marley loved seaside resort Essaouira and Mick Jagger and Keith Richards visited for the first time in 1967. A town of the Western imagination, Marrakesh has played **host** to everyone from Elton John to Vanessa Paradis, while Crosby, Stills and Nash recorded the hippie classic 'Marrakesh Express', and Blur made Think Tank there.

C) India

The Beatles went one better than the Stones - or rather, travelled further. **Seeking spiritual enlightenment**, they joined the likes of Donovan and Mike Love of the Beach Boys by the Ganges at Rishikesh in 1968. Ringo travelled with a suitcase full of **tins** of Heinz baked beans, while John went up in a helicopter with the Maharishi.

D) Berlin

In 1976, David Bowie started renting a cheap apartment above an auto-repair shop in the East German capital, looking for a period of calm in which to kick his cocaine habit. Who should turn up but Iggy Pop! But rather than **embark** on a hedonistic journey, Bowie visited the city's art galleries and worked on Heroes, also producing Lust For Life for the Ig. More recent visitors to the city include Nick Cave. Being the most popular destination among tourists this year, Berlin is definitely not to be missed.

E) Jamaica

Continuing their travels, the Stones started visiting the Caribbean island in the early Seventies, with Keith eventually buying a house in the hills above Ocho Rios (sometimes **inhabited** by Peter Tosh, until Keith grew tired of his freedom and **chased him out** with a gun). The Clash enjoyed a less happy stay, describing a place where 'every white face is an invitation to robbery' on 'Safe European Home'.

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F) Mali

Another exotic stamp in the passport of Damon Albarn: the Blur singer visited west Africa in 2000, looking for the roots of Western pop. **Likewise** Robert Plant, who came to the Festival in the Desert somewhere in the **vicinity** of Timbuktu in 2003 - an experience which inspired his impressive latest album. Blues musicians, such as Corey Harris, have also travelled to the country in search of musical parallels.

7) Jerusalem

After his motorcycle accident in Woodstock, Bob Dylan took a vacation to Israel, returning 15 years later, when he was photographed in a **skull** cap at the **Wailing Wall**, inviting speculation that he was (temporarily) returning to his Jewish **faith**. More recent visitors to the Holy City have included Madonna, who visited the local Kabbalah Centre on her own spiritual holiday last year, **amid** a paparazzi crush. *July 17, 2005 Observer Music Monthly*
